
I had the opportunity to use your lightweight cast stone product (Piazza Stone) on a recent project. The project added a colonnade on to the administration building of the Medical College of Georgia, changing a rear entrance into a main entrance to the building.

The Piazza Stone work included water tables, seats, whole and half columns as well as cornice work. The stone, once set into place, was hand "weathered" to match existing traditional cut stone on the building. We have found Piazza Stone to be a very economical (in both money and time) alternative to cast or cut stone and equal to it in appearance. With the attention to detail of your craftsmen, and the hand-staining process, it matched 50 year old stone without any difference in appearance.
